Products and Services

- Complaints against unethical behaviour
 - Information and Support editorial material.
 - Bi-annual Ethical Practices Survey and Report.
 - Forwarding complaints to regulatory and statutory bodies.
 - Collective Professional Body comment on legislature impacting on governance and unethical practices.
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How to forward your complaint

- The AEPF reviews matters forwarded by the Founding Members and Forum Partners.
- Complaints that concern whistleblowing, corruption and unethical practises are reviewed.
- Members reporting complaints to the AEPF must have exhausted all internal process at their working organisations.
- The complaint should then then be reported to your Professional Body.
- The Professional Body will then refer the case matter to the AEPF if the matter meets the case criteria.
- No police or court cases will be reviewed.
- No cases older than 2 years will be reviewed.
- An independent evaluations panel will review the complaint.
- Recommendations from the AEPF is optional and discretionary and not mandatory.
- Recommendations are solely based on factual information provided as given from the panel of experts who, voluntarily commit to membership on the AEPF Evaluations Panel.
- Recommendations can be forwarded to Statutory Bodies (Public Protector, IRBA or Public Protector) as formal cases from the AEPF.
